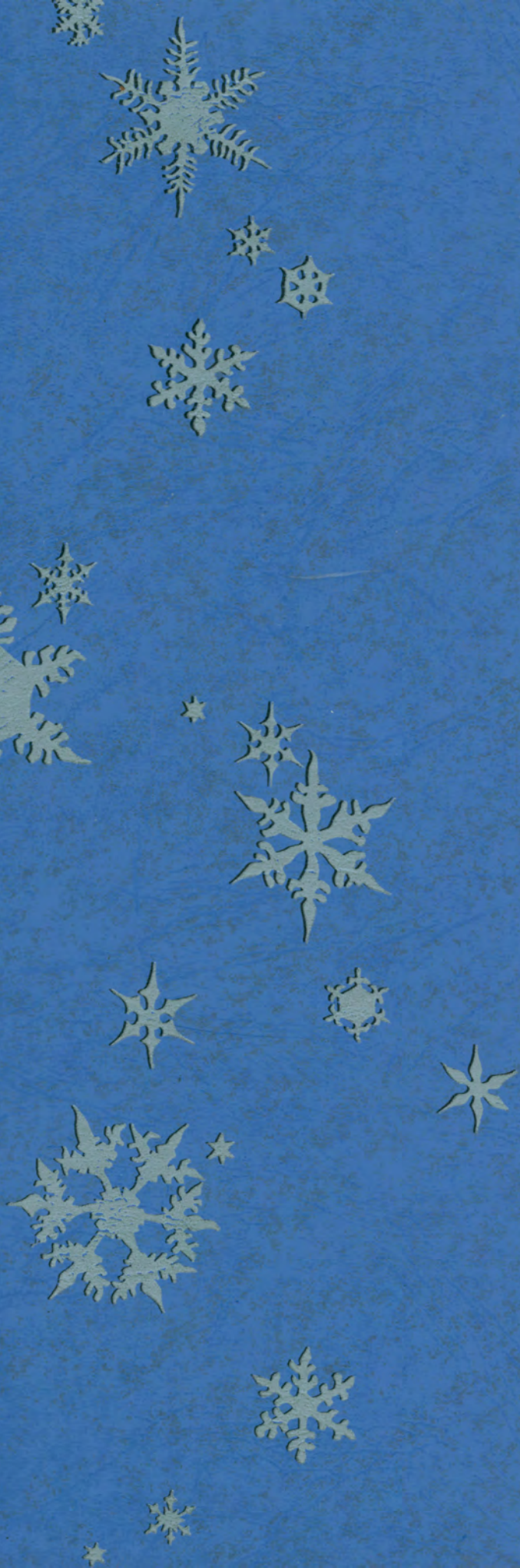

The Eastern Snow Conference is an informal group of businessmen, engineers, foresters, hydrologists, meteorologists, scientists and educators from the Eastern United States and Canada, which meets annually at some pre-selected location in New England, New York or Canada. The purpose of these meetings is the interchange of information related to snow, ice, frost, hail and other phenomena associated with the winter season.
